<u>Galileo was arrested because he argued that the sun was at the</u> <u>centre of the solar system.</u> This contradicted the church's view that the Earth was at the centre of the solar system.

12. How did the printing press change the way of life in Europe? (3 marks)

The printing press made it faster and less expensive to copy books. Books were printed in languages people spoke (French, German, and English), so more people learned to read. This allowed ideas, information, and inventions to be spread. People could read about scientific breakthroughs, which led to the Scientific Revolution.
