## Parking Lot

We know that parking is at a premium in the morning and at the end of the day. Please make sure you are not parking in the through lanes, bus lanes, or in no parking areas. Our drop-off area is just outside the library. If that is full, please park in the parking lot to avoid unsafe situations and blocking off traffic. Please use the crosswalk and crossing guard when moving back and forth between the parking lot and the school.

## Drop Off

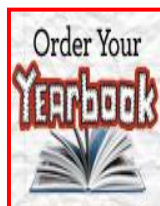
Supervision for students begins at 7:30 a.m. Please do not drop off your students or have them walk to school before supervision begins. We also ask that if you are using the drop-off lane, that you remain in your car. This will keep traffic flowing. If you need to get out of your car, please park in the parking lot.

## End of Day Pick Up

We are doing our best at the end of the day to ensure that students get to their busses on time, or for those that are picked up by a parent, that this happens safely. To reduce congestion, we ask that students and parents do not congregate at the front entrance so students can get to their bus or car without walking through a crowd. Students who are getting picked up by a car are asked to wait on the sidewalk in front of the library. We also ask that students who are walking, biking, or scooting home, to leave the campus right away. Those waiting for late buses are asked to wait on the playground and to avoid the front entranceway.

## School Photo Day

## Orange Shirt Day

This month, Tuesday, September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2025 will be recognized across the country as the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Please wear an orange shirt to honor the survivors of the residential school system, and to recognize the ongoing impacts today.

## Medical Alert

If your child has a medical condition or allergy that may be life-threatening, or requires your son or daughter to use an Epipen or Inhaler, please notify our office staff so that we are able to update our files with their correct information. Please provide the office staff with an up-to-date Epipen or Asthma Inhaler that can be kept on hand should your child require its use while they are at school. Students who use prescription medication at school are required to have a Medical Alert Form completed and kept on file at the school office.



## Technology Forms

At the end of August, the School District #33 Technology Acceptable Use Agreement form was sent out to all parents/guardians through **Permission Click**. It is important for all of our students, Grades K-8, to have this form completed in order for them to:

- Log-in to a school computer
- Use Student Wi-Fi
- Access any online services such as Office 365

All RTCS parents are also requested to complete the RTCS 2025-26 Media Parent Release form. These forms are required to be completed yearly for all students, and are available on your child's Student Quick Pay Account under Optional Items.



## Police Information Check

All volunteers with the Chilliwack School District are required to complete a Vulnerable Police Information Check (PIC) through the Criminal Records Review Program (CRRP). PIC's are effective for 5 years and there is no cost associated with the online form.

**All volunteer PIC applications are now required to be completed online.** Instructions are included in this newsletter.

Currently there are delays to the Criminal Records Review Program (CRRP / Policy Information Checks) due to the current BCGEU strike. This is affecting how quickly applications can be processed. Here's what parents need to know:

- **Online applications** using a **BC Services Card** are still being processed and should be used whenever possible.
- Applications needing fingerprinting or adjudication will face longer delays. We do not have a timeline for this.
- **CRRP phone and email support is not available** right now. Emails and phone calls will not be returned during the strike.

## Library Learning Commons News

### Kiwanis Super Readers – Elementary:



The Kiwanis Super Reader program is happening once again for our elementary students. All elementary students are eligible for prizes for every 25 nights read (or being read to) that are recorded on their “Reading Log”. Reading Logs are found in student planners; kindergarten students will be getting single page paper reading logs. Once students have completed 25 nights, they can bring their reading log to the library for a prize. There will be special presentations upon reaching 100 nights and 200 nights. If your child has been reading (or read to) consistently, please start from the first day of school.

### Library Volunteers - Grades 5 - 8:

Students from grades 5 to 8 are invited to apply to be a library volunteer; they can listen to the announcements for information. These students will have 1 – 3 shifts per week (before school or at lunch) to help with a variety of tasks. Grade 8 students that are consistent and reliable throughout the year are welcome to ask for a reference letter in June.

### Wool / Yarn Donations:

Our library has acquired a few round knitting looms; making toques to donate to a local charity is a fun service project. If you have any clean yarn that would be suitable for this project, please send it in with your youth and ask them to drop it off in the library.



## RTCS Athletics Department

We are looking forward to another year of movement and skill-building in the gym! As we prepare for a new year of instruction, please remember that your child needs proper fitting indoor running shoes (that they can tie independently) and a water bottle for all PHE classes.

All **numbered**, red, microfibre Ravens Athletics t-shirts belong to the school. They are used for team sports. If you have a red, numbered athletic shirt at home, please send it back to school with your child. If you would like to purchase any Ravens apparel, please order online or through the office.

# Applicant Guide Police Information Check

All volunteers and homestay parents with the Chilliwack School District are required to complete a Vulnerable Police Information Check (PIC) through the Criminal Records Review Program (CRRP). PIC's are effective for 5 years and there is no cost associated with the online form.

In accordance with the Criminal Records Review Act, Applicants for volunteering, section 24.4 *(1) Before working with children or working with vulnerable adults as a volunteer with a registered specified organization, an individual must provide to the registered specified organization a criminal record check authorization or a criminal record check verification authorization, as applicable.*

### Criminal Record Check

In British Columbia, if you work or volunteer with, or have the potential for unsupervised access to children and/or vulnerable adults, you are required to complete a criminal record check.

How do I submit a CRC request online?

To submit an online request for a criminal record check, you must:

- Be at least 12 years of age as of today's date.
- Have an access code provided by your organization.
- Have your identity verified by using the BC Services Card Login. If you choose not to use the BC Services Card Login, your organization will verify your ID after you submit your criminal record check.

## Consent to a Criminal Record Check

## SafeArrival Letter to Parents

September 12, 2025

Dear RTCS Parents/Guardians:

At School District #33 (Chilliwack), one of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely at school each and every day.

To enhance our existing absence-checking procedure, we are introducing **a new, more efficient** student absence reporting system called **SafeArrival**. This new system will reduce the time it takes to verify student attendance, make it easy for you to report your child's absence and easy for staff to respond to unexplained student absences.

With **SafeArrival**, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these 3 convenient methods:

- 1) Using your mobile device, download and install the **SchoolMessenger app** from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at <https://www.sd33.bc.ca/safe-arrival> ). The first time you use the app, select **Sign Up** to create your account. Select **Attendance** then **Report an Absence**.
- 2) Use the SafeArrival website, <https://www.sd33.bc.ca/safe-arrival>. The first time you use the website, select **Sign Up** to create your account. Select **Attendance** then **Report an Absence**.

Call the toll-free number **1-833-698-6567** to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

In addition, we will use the **SchoolMessenger Communicate** automated notification system to contact parents whose child is absent when the absence was not reported in advance. The automated notification system will attempt to contact parents at multiple contact points until a reason is submitted for the absence. If our system is unable to reach the designated contacts, office staff will follow up.

If you report your child's absence in advance using the **SafeArrival** toll-free number, website or mobile app, you will NOT receive these notifications.

Please report absences in advance using **SafeArrival** instead of sending notes or calling/emailing the school.
