Parking Lot

We know that parking is at a premium in the morning and at the end of the day. Please make sure you are not parking in the through lanes, bus lanes, or in no parking areas. Our drop-off area is just outside the library. If that is full, please park in the parking lot to avoid unsafe situations and blocking off traffic. Please use the crosswalk and crossing guard when moving back and forth between the parking lot and the school.

Drop Off

Supervision for students begins at 7:30 a.m. Please do not drop off your students or have them walk to school before supervision begins. We also ask that if you are using the drop-off lane, that you remain in your car. This will keep traffic flowing. If you need to get out of your car, please park in the parking lot.

End of Day Pick Up

We are doing our best at the end of the day to ensure that students get to their busses on time, or for those that are picked up by a parent, that this happens safely. To reduce congestion, we ask that students and parents do not congregate at the front entrance so students can get to their bus or car without walking through a crowd. Students who are getting picked up by a car are asked to wait on the sidewalk in front of the library. We also ask that students who are walking, biking, or scootering home, to leave the campus right away. Those waiting for late buses are asked to wait on the playground and to avoid the front entranceway.




Mark Your Calendar!

series of trivia-style challenges based on six books which are changed every year. There is a school challenge, from which one team moves on to a community challenge, and one team from the region will even move on to a provincial competition held in the lower mainland.

Congratulations to those who have turned in 25 and even 50 nights of reading! All elementary students are invited to participate and work toward up to 200 nights of reading. Each evening your child reads (or is read to) for 15 minutes gets recorded in their "Reading Log" (in Agenda Book for grades 1 - 5 or on a red paper for the kindergarten classes).
